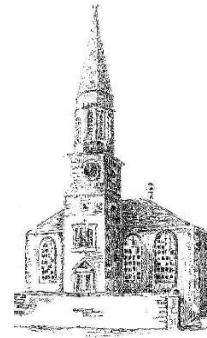

NEWS FROM THE CHURCH OF SCOTLAND WEBSITE

THE STAMP PROJECT WILL BE COMING TO AN END IN FEBRUARY 2026 AFTER 56 YEARS.

“It has been a pivotal part of World Mission Council, collecting much needed money for projects from Partner Churches around the world simply by collecting used stamps.

From 1995 to 2024 an amazing total of £96,459.67 has been raised for projects such as the HIV programme and Mount Olivet Boys' home in Jamaica & Cayman Islands.”

We have been supporting the Stamp Appeal for many years, but sadly the project will end this month. Jennifer has kindly sent our saved stamps to the appropriate place on our behalf, but from now onwards we will not be collecting any more stamps.

Sincere thanks to everyone who has kept their stamps and supported this Appeal over many years.

If you would you like to provide Flowers for the Sanctuary, please write your name beside your chosen date. After the Service the flowers are distributed to the ill, housebound and bereaved, or alternatively you might like to donate to the Flower Fund – there is a box at each door – to finance Sundays when flowers are not being provided by members. Help for Ukraine Newstart Recycle (23 Queensberry Street). continue collecting goods for the Ukrainian refugees. The type of goods required are blankets, towels, good clean women and children's clothes, small toys for orphanages, school-wear, medication, dry food, toiletries, tinned food and pet food. Financial help would be welcome too. (Duvets and pillows are not being sent but will be used locally).
