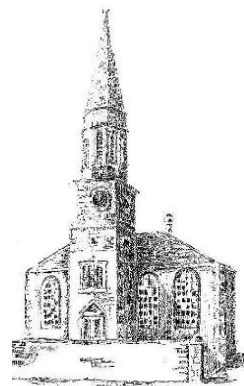
Communion at both Churches was scheduled for 17th May, this will now take place at both Churches on **Sunday 7th June**, all are most welcome.
